The City of Dawson Creek is a community at the forefront of sustainability and longevity by constantly exploring new initiatives to improve their social, cultural, economic and environmental position. One such initiative is the ability to reduce the amount of water being withdrawn from the City's sole water source, the Kiskatinaw River. There has been a significant increase in the demand for water over the past few years and the majority of the water demand can be linked to the increased oil and gas exploration in the area.

The City of Dawson Creek is exploring the opportunity to use reclaimed water to provide a viable product for various uses including Oil and Gas field operations, dust control, irrigation, among others.
